## Yet Another Dude! Rapid Redux, Glamorista, Top Beyers

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It appears there were actually three fast Dudes that ran last week.

\*We all know the exploits of FIRST DUDE and GAME ON DUDE, the Bob Baffert-trained stablemates that ran one-two in a cracking renewal of the 10-furlong Hollywood Gold Cup. But not far behind them on the Beyer scale was 3-year-old SOUTHERN DUDE, who scored at first asking for trainer Roger Brueggemann and Midwest Thoroughbreds. From the first crop of Cigar Mile winner Lion Tamer, the Louisiana-bred colt received a 101 Beyer Speed Figure after stepped six furlongs over the Arlington polytrack in 1:11.55. A \$27,000 yearling purchase, Southern Dude is out of the Cobra King mare Viva Vega, a full sister to multiple stakes-winning sprinter Follow Me Home.

The runner-up, SOULTOWN, on the chase throughout for trainer Donnie Von Hemel, may be one to watch as well. A gelded son of Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vindication, Soultown was also bred in Louisiana. He sold for \$12,000 as a yearling and is a half-brother to Lovely Tribute, a stakes-placed sprinter. The dam, Lovely Amanda, was a versatile New York-bred, winning route stakes races on both turf and dirt.

\*GLAMORISTA's career debut was worth the wait. A 4-year-old filly by Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Florida Derby winner Unbridled's Song, Glamorista sold for \$325,000 as a yearling and is a half-sister to multiple Grade 1 route winner Critical Eye. She received a 95 Beyer Speed Figure for Baffert.

\*RICORIATOA, a 5-year-old half-brother to multiple Grade 3 route winner Thiskyhasnolimit, popped a triple-digit Beyer in a \$25,000 beaten claimer at Belmont. He was claimed by Chris Englehart.

Hey Dan,

***"First off I'm biased because I work for the Pennsylvania HBPA, but we have a horse here that is going for his 12th straight in 2011 and 14th straight overall on Friday at Mountaineer and think he should get some attention. He has been running in very low level starter allowance races, but you win 13 in a row at any stage and you have to be a good horse. In 33 career starts he has 19 wins. Not bad for the five-year-old gelding."***

Rapid Redux is the hottest horse in North America and his past performances are available at the bottom of this blog post. A 5-year-old son of Breeders' Cup Classic, Dubai World Cup and Pacific Classic winner Pleasantly Perfect, Rapid Redux has won 13 races in a row by utilizing his excellent early speed. Originally an \$85,000 yearling purchase, Rapid Redux was third in the three-horse Tyro Stakes at Monmouth as a 2-year-old. He's a full brother to Grade 3-placed miler Sacred Journey and stakes-winning router Be Like Mike and has really turned his career around since being claimed by David Wells last October. Rapid Redux drew the rail and is 2-5 on the morning line in Friday's ninth race at Mountaineer, a \$5,000 starter allowance at one mile.

UNZIP ME ranks as one of the top turf sprinters in the country, with a score to settle against SEPARATE FOREST. When they met in April, 'FOREST had a nine-pound weight break and won by a neck. Now they carry equal weight, UNZIP ME has trained well after recovering from a respiratory infection, and loves the Hollywood turf course. Drawn outside her main rival, 11-for-19 UNZIP ME enters as the most probable winner on the card. SEPARATE FOREST defeated the top choice in April, and returned to form last out finishing second behind a filly (Givine) that returned to bomb around two turns.

Lily Lane might run & gun she may be one of the better ones & this soft spot could allow for a mild surprise.

Promise to Sharona doesn't appear to be impossible, she may go favored. IRL I wouldn't consider a win bet on any of the others with someone else's money. Fair enough. I didn't try or expect to embarrass you about your brain--brains are some of my favorite things. I'm an eager student of neuroplasticity, and think that if people born blind can learn to "see" through sensory stimulus (see Bach-y-Rita's original sensory substitution work in the '60s, or /The Brain that Changes Itself/ by Norman Doidge, MD), we can definitely teach (willing) old dogs new tricks, including how we dispute. 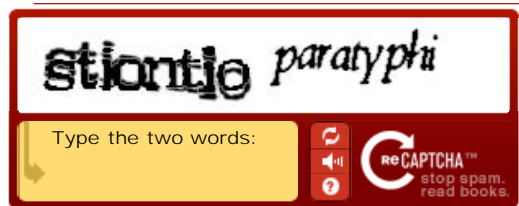
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
